For much of the past month I've been on a marvelous trip around Ireland with Katie, so instead of a formal letter, this is more of a "postcard" selection of notes and observations while abroad:

The first few days in Dublin were eye-opening in terms of all the changes going on since I first got familiar with it—which was only back in 1988! Dublin continues its trajectory, being a cosmopolitan city of the world, complete with freeway around the perimeter, brand-new light rail system for commuters, and people from literally all over the world strolling up and down O'Connell Street... and of course home prices that exceed those in the Bay Area, given the current strength of the Euro!

A few choice days in Longford followed, thanks to the wonderful hospitality of our friend Kitty Carberry (who says "hello" to her good friends here!). Highlights here included a fascinating tour of a nearby Iron Age plank road at Corlea, and a great session at the pub in Newtown Cashel – both featuring Kitty's brother Noel, a fine uilleann piper, storyteller, and guide.

From there, on to Willie Clancy week in Miltown Malbay! Or at least a few days of it... Everywhere we had gone, people had related all sorts of stories and advice to us about the school/festival, and they all turned out to be true: there are so many things going on in a wide variety of different places, I'm quite convinced you could attend the full week and not find someone you are looking for, and know is there! At the same time, you'd be likely to encounter all sorts of people you know from all over – in a little over two days there, we got a quick guide to

town when we bumped into Andrew McNamara and Bernadette Flynn the first night, saw Dave Holland and Aleta Hancock (set dancing at the Armada, of course!), and spent two great evenings outside town in the village of Coore, with Larry and Shaina Lynch and their friends. And of course, great music all around, all the time!

Since time was short, though, we headed up the coast to Doolin, and caught a SMALL ferryboat out to the Aran Islands. Fortunately, the weather was gorgeous and calm, so our ride out to all three of the islands in turn was uneventful, and we arrived on Inis Mor intact. The dozen or so towns and villages are just the right distance apart for cycling, so we had a fine tour on hired bikes the first day. For the second day, though, I had other ideas: I had been out walking along the Western cliffs years ago on my first visit, and the place held a special magic for me, which I wanted to share with Katie. Now it has some extra magic for both of us, since while we were exploring the Black fort, after enjoying a picnic lunch on the sunny cliffs, she accepted my proposal that we get married! Needless to say, Inis Mor was probably our favorite part of the trip. But we did move on after a few days to the Galway area, and spent a very pleasant time touring first through Connemara, then up around Westport (which has some fine dining!) and through Mayo – where the new monument to the famine is a memorable sight.

Naturally, we had at least a little rain on most days of the trip, but the showers were short, and the spaces between included plenty of blue sky and sunshine as well. I'm sure we will be returning!
