## - FROM THE CHAIRMAN...

Dear Friends and Members of Comhaltas,

I'm writing this fresh from returning from our latest **CHILDREN'S CÉILÍ**, which is now being held four times per year at the UICC, and which seems to be growing into a popular event with our youngest friends and their parents. There were about 25 children attending, and thanks to Michael Murphy they all got involved in at least some of the Irish dancing. Maureen Murphy and Joannie O'Leary led a nice sing-along portion as well. It's great to see the children enjoying the music and dancing, and perhaps catching a spark of future enthusiasm for these aspects of the Irish culture. The next Children's Ceili will probably be in late April or early May, so stay tuned.

There have apparently been some changes this year in the organization of the **St. Patrick's Day Parade**, due to its being the 150th Anniversary, and these have made the nature of our participation a bit unclear as of the time of this writing. The United Irish Societies will be sponsoring a number of "official" floats in this year's parade, and it appears that Comhaltas may be featured on one of these. Participating on a major float would be a significant change from our usual entry, but one way or another we will be well represented in this year's event.

We are eagerly awaiting this month's arrival of **PATRICK O'DEA**, who will be teaching a **SET DANCING WORKSHOP** on the afternoon of **February 23rd**, at the Star of the Sea school, which will be a new venue for us. This will be followed by a full **CÉILÍ MOR** that evening, at the same location, including set dancing (especially the new sets learned that afternoon!) as well as some of the favorite céilí dances, and of course great music. Please look for printed announcements, and see our web site, for details.

As I mentioned last month, I feel it's important to hear from the membership of our branch about which activities they would especially like to attend. Enclosed within this issue is a single page questionnaire that I heartily encourage all members to take a few moments to fill out and mail back to us. It isn't a ballot, so no one should be concerned about their favorite activity "losing" anything – but it is a great opportunity to look over all the activities which our branch already sponsors, and to think about how you might contribute to something that is near and dear to your heart.

Finally, let me take a moment to make an observation. As you will see from the questionnaire, we are now sponsoring a variety of activities, each of which focuses on a particular part of the culture – and we may soon have others. To me, the Comhaltas céilís can be places where all our interests come together for

a broad celebration of Irish culture. For example, we have started to include a “music session” immediately prior to the dancing program at the céilís, and this gives the musicians who are learning at our slow sessions a good motivation to practice specific tunes, a chance to play informally in an “outside” venue, and greater exposure to all the other parts of the culture. Song and storytelling, and Irish language activities could similarly be regular parts of the céilís, and provide a focused goal for the meetings of these individual activities. Our céilís could then become a central feature for many of our members, and include participation by those with many different interests in the Irish culture.
