Dear Friends and Members,

Summer Greetings to all of you in the Comhaltas community!

It was a great pleasure to see so many familiar faces, and dancing feet, at the party on June 1st in honor of Jim Belcher and his contributions to our group. The nostalgic aspects were even kept at bay to some extent by the good news that Jim will be able to visit us (and dance, of course!) with some regularity over this summer, as he makes the transition in working from here to Seattle.

Looking ahead a bit to the end of summer, I'd like to announce that near the end of August, our branch of Comhaltas will be holding a one-day Irish Music Workshop, which will serve as a "kickoff" event for our music instruction program. While the details are still being ironed out, we are planning to provide an introduction and some instruction on a variety of traditional Irish instruments to those at beginner and intermediate levels, so keep your eyes open for a separate flyer describing this special event!

In looking forward to the longer term for the developing music program, there is one very obvious obstacle to those who are interested in learning to play: having access to a decent instrument on which to learn and practice. For many people, buying any instrument beyond a

tin whistle is in one sense a risky investment, especially if they have to do so just to explore the possibility, before they have had any lessons or experience. This is particularly true for parents whose children may want to learn. To help reduce this barrier, our Comhaltas branch is looking to develop a modest collection of instruments which interested beginners could borrow for a limited time, to ensure that no one is prevented from trying out their hand at traditional Irish music for lack of access to an instrument. Please see the short article within this issue for further information about this.

Many of us are either in the middle of planning or already embarked on summer holidays, trips abroad or other special events. In keeping with this, a few of our "regular" events are similarly on a month or two of holiday, so please check within this newsletter for details of what is happening in July, or contact the organizers if you are unsure.

****New Life for an Old Instrument?*

Do you have an old flute somewhere in the back of a closet, half-forgotten and unplayed for many years? Perhaps a beginner's fiddle, which one of the children used for music lessons for a few years back when they were in school, but which now lies silent? Or maybe it's an accordion, or a guitar... Would you consider donating such an instrument, so that someone just starting out on the road of playing Irish music has an instrument to learn on?

To be useful in our developing program for teaching, the donated instruments need not be in tip-top shape, as we intend to work with music repair shops to "tune up" instruments prior to loaning them out. Because our group is an official nonprofit organization, donating such instruments may

even help out a bit with your tax situation (this requires a closer look!) – but apart from the economics, such a donation can be a very satisfying way of contributing to a larger community, especially by helping to pass along a cultural tradition as strong and vibrant as traditional Irish music.
