FROM THE CHAIRMAN...

Dear Friends and Members,

A warm welcome back to those in our branch who have recently returned from St. Louis, attending this year's North American Comhaltas convention! I was not able to attend myself, but from the early reports I've heard, it sounds like there was the usual non-stop offerings of music and dancing to enjoy, and perhaps a bit more space than usual in which to take it all in. Many thanks to those who represented our branch at the administrative meetings, for dragging themselves away from the other festivities to work for our organization.

While there may be an understandable tendency to relax a bit in the spring season, following the flurry of events that we have been enjoying, I'd like to suggest that now is an excellent time to step back, take a broad view of what we're doing, and begin to chart some new directions. Based on both the responses to the questionnaire earlier this year, and many exchanges with a variety of people over the past few months, there is strong support for increasing the emphasis on traditional music in our branch's activities.

Our branch has benefited from a core group of musicians in the membership for years, and many of us depend on the presence of good music when it comes to dancing, yet in other ways we have supported it rather sparsely. We have taken a few steps in promoting the music over the past year through the creation of the Cooley-Keegan session, now twice each month, and the Song and Storytelling session. Both of these have developed a regular following of enthusiastic participants, many of whom were unfamiliar with Comhaltas beforehand.

Potential musical activities include sponsoring regular instruction for learners of all ages, organizing music workshops taught by local or visiting experienced players, and special musical events such as sessions or concerts. In conversations with musicians in the local Irish music "scene", I've noticed that there is nearly always strong support for developing a music instruction program, even among those who are not active members.

It's important to keep in mind, though, that none of these activities will spring forth overnight, fully developed and immediately comparable to the long-standing musical programs at other branches. All of them

would require some careful planning, especially in regard to who will be developing and running them, and how they could be funded – and I'd be the last person to suggest we try to take them all on simultaneously! But promoting traditional music is a central mission of Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann, and I think now is the time to take the next steps toward fulfilling that mission.
