I'm hoping that at least one or two of the attendees will be willing to share their impressions (and photographs!) with us in the next issue of the newsletter, and perhaps post a number of the photos on the web site as well. As many of you know, next April's convention will be hosted by the Ottawa branch, which should prove to be a great new venue – and there is continued interest, at the Provincial, Regional and Branch levels, to bring the Convention back to San Francisco in 2007!

So, while May often marks a time for us to collectively “catch our breath” after the flurry of spring events, this year it also brings with it the opportunity to set our sights beyond the next local seisiun or ceili – there are some major potential events looming on the horizon, and they require some attention very soon!

Initial work has already started to see whether hosting the 2007 Convention could be feasible here, since the Convention planning process has changed considerably since our successful campaign in 1998.

If the decision is made to “go for it,” we will be facing a long, sustained need for dedicated people to make it happen – clear your calendars now!

As a “practice run,” so to speak, it looks like our branch will be hosting a smaller “mini-convention” this coming Fall, which will be the first official major event of the West Region. We intend to include dancing, music, language and singing workshops, and an evening concert, and hope it will both draw Comhaltas members from throughout the West, but also serve to expose many other people in the Bay Area with Irish cultural interests to come out and join us for the weekend. You will be hearing a lot more about this event in the next few months, and I would strongly encourage anyone interested in leading or coordinating workshops to speak with Michael Duffy or myself about the plans that are developing
