Our numbers this year at the Children's Ceilis have skyrocketed to 30-35 kids on average with parents in tow. This surge began at our February 2004 Ceili and, ironically, it was not too well advertised, but that's OK. The power of the word-of-mouth is never to be underestimated, and a steady flow of supportive families and energetic youngsters have been gracing our Cooley-Keegan Branch ever since. Presently, we just experienced a double-feature of two October events designed for children

- October 10th – CCE Children's Ceili that happened at the United Irish Cultural Center. This regular event has been growing as fast as the Millere kids who have been attending since its inception. That's right, the very first Children's Ceili started way back in September of 1997! It's still going strong! On this second Sunday of October, we witnessed a population explosion of 43 kids (a grand new record), and as one delighted parent pointed out: most of these kids had new faces. Oh we had a few hearty regulars all right such as Emily, the Gannons, the Lyons (the list goes on), but the special, energetic nature of this afternoon owes much its success to the new families as well as the regulars filled with mostly 4-10 year olds. (Toddlers and tweens are also welcome.)
- October 24th – Children's Tin Whistle workshops led by Deirdre McKinney and Martine Millere and Accordion Demonstration and Workshop led by our featured weekend performer, John Whelan. It was quite a sight to see and treasure John intensely and supportively giving tips one-on-one to our bright, young accordionist, Sean O'Donnell, who was tenaciously and enthusiastically adapting some of Mr. Whelan's helpful hints about how to effectively manage the challenging notes pouring out of an accordion
